Definition

Historically, transportation options (TO) has been referred to as “transportation demand management” focused on managing the demand of the transportation system – i.e. carpooling, high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes, and other congestion mitigation strategies to reduce reliance on single occupant vehicle travel.



Definition

This Plan extends the definition of TO beyond the traditional definition of managing demand to also include the value of providing transportation choices to residents, employees, and visitors alike. TO strategies, programs, services, and investments enhance traveler opportunities and promote efficient travel options to bike, walk, take transit, drive, share rides, and telecommute.
